BATON OF HOPE TOURS TAMESIDE

The Anthony Seddon
Fund was proud to
bring Baton of Hope
to Tameside on Friday,
12th September 2025,
with a message of courage,
compassion, and collective
action in the face of suicide.
At the launch the charity was
joined by Greater Manchester
Mayor Andy Burnham and the
founder of the Baton himself
Mike McCarthy who lost
his 31-year-old son Ross to
suicide in February 2021.

This symbolic journey, part of a nationwide movement, saw the Baton carried through the Tameside community by those whose lives have been touched by suicide, mental health challenges, and the unwavering desire to make a difference. It's more than a procession, it's a call to action. It provided a moment to stand together, speak openly, and shine a light on hope. After touring locations around Tameside the event came to a

close with stalls, entertainment and activities at the Victoria Market Hall in Stalybridge where they were joined by the Civic Mayor of Tameside, Cllr Shibley Alam and Executive Leader of Tameside Council, Cllr Eleanor Wills

"We're proud to be part of this national movement," said Ben James, General Manager at The Anthony Seddon Fund. "The Baton of Hope is a symbol of our shared commitment to saving lives, breaking stigma, and building a future where no one feels alone."

The Tameside Beer Festival, now in its 13th year, returned to its 'home' at the Stalybridge Civic Hall on Friday 19th and Saturday 20th September 2025.The event raised funds primarily for Willow

There was an eclectic mix of live entertainment throughout the two days including on the Friday, Tameside Community Voices, Mossley Ukulele Group, a special performance by the Global Grooves troupe and doing it the 'strangers' way, the welcomed return

of classic rock band, the Company of Strangers. Saturday's line up featured two big bands – High Peak Big Band and St John's Brass Band, Singer/Guitarist Andy Sproston and the very popular group Pattison Fogg.

The Beer Festival is organised by Tameside Rotary and Tameside Rotarian, Peter who co-ordinated the event, said: "We are very grateful to our sponsors, advertisers, supporters and volunteers without whom we would be unable to put on an event of this size."

A refurbished crazy golf course is now open for children, young people and residents to have a 'hole lot of fun' whilst also an added attraction for Stamford Park. This project was funded by Tameside Futures, part of Tameside Council's Employment & Skills service, in collaboration with The Growth Company.

Piece together a career

Tameside Council's Employment and Skills Team have partnered with Jigsaw Homes, to host the annual Autumn Jobs Fair at Dukinfield Town Hall - a free event on Wednesday 1st October, 10am-1pm, where attendees can discover potential vacancies and upskilling opportunities.

Space for an award

Tameside Council has been presented with a rare business award for its free parking initiative aimed at supporting town centres. The Federation of Small Businesses presented its Business Buddy Award to the council on September 3rd after the authority introduced two hours of free parking Monday to Saturday before 6pm in all of its car parks.

Denton Regeneration

Tameside Council has been awarded £16.8m from Round 3 of the Government's Levelling Up Fund for regeneration in Denton - with £2m earmarked for delivering a sustainable future for Denton Festival Hall which closed last month. The investment will see the building transformed into a mixture of residential and community uses, including the retention of the Festival Hall, to best meet the town's needs.

He never turned his back on where he came from which endeared him to locals and many in the boxing fraternity.

He was so proud of the town that he persuaded legendary American boxer Muhammad Ali, to come to open Ricky's Hatton Health and Fitness in Hyde back in August 2009. His achievements in the ring made him a star across the world that included winning world titles in two

weight classes. His

stunning 2005 victory

over Kostya Tszyu in Manchester made him

the light welterweight

champion.

His 15 year career cemented his reputation as a tough opponent and reinforced his 'Hitman' reputation. But more than anything Ricky was The People's Champion, he was Hyde's champion with an approachable aura and always ready





to spend time with local people. During Christmas last year he was delighted to lend support to Tameside Council's Shop Local campaign recognising the importance of small local businesses in the area.

Ricky meant a lot to so many people and Hyde will always remember Ricky 'The Hitman' Hatton – our thoughts are with his family, friends and fans as the town also comes to terms with losing its champion.


"A Nightmare on Market Avenue"

Cameraz on Stamford Street. For those who might be interested in purchasing original work or to have a commission they can check out his website at www.stevenbruceart.co.uk.



TAMESIDE LOCAL HISTORY FORUM

Celebrating 25 years

The Forum was formed in 2000 as a "voice for Heritage" in Tameside. Key members of Local History groups in Tameside met at the opening of Portland Basin Museum in 1999.

During a discussion it was agreed how they might better share / co-ordinate with each other, TMBC and other Societies.

There didn't seem to be any interaction on issues such as buildings of interest, Blue Plaques and Publications. Also sharing information with press and public interaction. In January 2000 the 'TAMESIDE LOCAL HISTORY FORUM' was formed with funding for meetings and a constitution was agreed.

Our first newsletter was produced by members in April, followed by two each year up to 2005. Member groups ranged from 15 to 30 covering Local History, Family History, Canals, Churches, Museums, Local Studies and Civic Societies, W.I. Groups and Archaeological Societies, Military, Blue Badge Guides and many more, including many individuals.

The newsletters were free to the public, sponsored by Sir George Kenyon, the Building Bridges project (Volunteer Centre) the University of Manchester Archaeological Unit, Community Foundation for GM. and Tameside Heritage Development Fund.

The First 'History Alive' Tameside newsletter was produced for 5 years full of many interesting facts. Which you can now see on our website www.tamesidehistoryforum.org.uk.

In 2000 Alan E. Rose and Jill Cronin both well respected local Historians ran a WEA course (11 weeks) for public to learn more about Local History, it was from these courses that most of our members began the journey of finding out about the history of Tameside's nine towns. The group 'History on your Doorstep' still exists today meeting at Local Studies each Thursday 1pm-3pm.

The Forum members have supported Heritage Open Days since 2002, a national event which we still organise

to date. Look out for 2025's booklet produced by members.

Our first History Fair was held in an empty shop in Arcades shopping centre kindly supported by them for a day in February 2003 where groups displayed their work. February 2004 'The Ladysmith' shopping centre also supported us with an empty shop for another Heritage Fair.

In 2005 a fantastic purpose-built Local Studies was officially opened, today you can find almost anything in the way of maps, books, documents and images relating to our Heritage in Tameside and beyond. The Forum has a long relationship with the library and its staff, often working on projects together, also with the support of Portland Basin Museum.

We are proud to have been involved in several TV programmes including 'Who do you think you are' Dan Cruikshank on' Donkey Stones' and Julian Fellowes 'The Gorse Hall murder'. The Moravian settlement has been filmed several times over the years.

Exhibitions include, Peterloo, Guide Bridge, Cockbrook,' Do you remember the Co-op' and many more, see our website. 2025 celebrates 25 years of the Forum.

The History on your Doorstep group were involved in the 'SMILE PROJECT' for the Reporter Newspaper, which has supported the Forum's projects since 2000.



Archaeological community digs have been held at Gorse Hall, Denton, and Newton Hall with members and schools participating with support from Manchester Archaeological Unit and Salford University.

We were proud to have been Awarded 'Best Community' website in 2007/8.

Through links with other umbrella organisations in Greater Manchester our constitution has been used as a template.

In 2025 the exhibition marking this was in Ashton Market and Portland Basin Museum we hope this gives the public a flavour of our members achievements, keeping to our aims and objectives of 2000.

This month sees Ashton's flagship shopping centre - The Arcades celebrate its 30th anniversary. How time flies, this popular outlet is still going strong today and has seen many changes over the years.

It was the first fully covered shopping centre in the town with seating areas for shoppers to sit and rest and with the start of the National Lottery the year prior it, boasted a stand alone lottery kiosk.

Situated outside W H Smiths was the famous and well-loved bronze statue of The Black Knight. This unique sculpture was made by the Anglo-











Dutch sculptress Marjan Wouda. The Black Knight took pride of place on a large plinth with seating placed around its base.

The statue commemorated a former knight reputed to be Ralph De Assheton who was regarded as a much-feared man locally as a tyrant for various cruel acts in his time.

Over the years The Arcades has held many events all year round to bring shoppers and visitors in. Lots of entertainers from mime artistes to balloon modellers have appeared in the centre. The very popular annual Sci-Fi event has been a mainstay with characters from Doctor Who. Star Wars and Star Trek appearing regularly.







At Christmas time there have been many different Santas Grottos, do you remember the year they had the winter Yeti and his snow setting once the Black Knight had been moved out?

There have been a few celebrities on show in Arcades too. Joe Swash opened Poundworld when they moved into the old Woolworths on the ground floor, and the centre was full of teenage girls when Simon Webbe of boy band Blue cut the ribbon on the HMV Record Store.

Several large well known household names have graced Arcades over the years including Adams, the children's outfitters, Argos, Dixons, Lunn Poly Travel Agents, Thorntons and Woolworths. MAKING MONSTERS

When Hyde Fundraisers began their support for BBC Children in Need back in 1985, they relied on member Nigel Peever in Crewe coming up with creative costumes like Cybermen for events. The group's first Dalek and Davros came courtesy of John Ashton from Openshaw who met the group at an event in Manchester.

Things took a step up with the involvement of Andrew Crombie from Newton in Hyde who put his creative skills to make two accurate classic grey daleks — one of which is still in the group and appeared in the recent Doctor Who finale. Andy also created other props like a Police Box along with Cybermen heads and chest units.

The group then had the support of other creative costume and mask makers to bring their characters to life. These included sculptor Philip Robinson who made many of the creatures for the groups Trial of Davros show at Tameside Hippodrome. Phil also created an uncanny sculpt of fourth Doctor Tom Baker and made many classic Dr Who monster masks such as a Vogan, Kraal and for the group's Davros character. Derek Handley from London also has a long association with the group and back in 2018 made an army of Voc Robots from the story Robots of Death. He has also been the curator for the new exhibition in Peterborough that features many of Hyde Fundraisers Dr Who characters.

Ray Phillips from Morpeth first brought his Dalek to events but is now a talented sculptor and prop builder himself. His contributions have included Scarecrows, Pig Slaves, Ood, Gallifreyan Guard helmets. Scaroth, Brannigan and most recently The Emperor from Star Wars. With the onset of 3d printing the group have had contributions from Jon Hall who recently made the Colonial Marine Armour from Aliens, Wolverine helmet and pieces from Star Wars.

Cheryl Revell (formerly Mellor) got involved with Hyde Fundraisers when she had her Dizzi Gothic business in Ashton. She took on a number of projects from making Clockwork Robot period costumes to characters from Planet of the Apes. Her other contributions also include the Kraal costume. Judoon costume, Vogan costume, vintage Cyberman, Auton bride and the Gallifreyan guard outfits!

Props most recently have been provided by Pete Brocklehurst from Hyde with his R2D2 and he has also become the adopted 'Vet' for the groups K-9 too. Over in Crewe Kevin Davies has created some amazing props and models including ORAC from Blakes 7, NOMAD from Star Trek and his own robot dog K-9.

Leaves will now begin to fall so they should be collected to make compost and there are wonderful bargains to be had in end-of-season or discontinued line gardening gear at supermarkets and cut-price stores, take advantage and start collecting ready for next year but always check the date code of any reduced seeds.

and celebration.

Next we need to clean and disinfect the greenhouse, be it plastic or glass, clean the outside of the roof in particular with a long, soft brush, to maximise the winter light levels inside. We need to ensure that the heat from the sun really does help your overwinter plants. Remember that herbs need to come into the greenhouse in the winter months to avoid the frost if you want to save re-buying come spring.

Now before the weather forms the soil into mud turn the soil with the spade or rotivator if you have a bigger space, forking it is just as good (forking the lawn helps with drainage), once done, cover it for when you are ready to begin again. This is the time to start preparing new borders to be planted next year so dig them over to a few spades' depths, taking out weed roots and adding coarse, old compost or

fallen leaves. If making a bed from lawn, lay the turf upside-down in the bottom of the bed, but only if it doesn't contain perennial weeds.

Dry off baskets and pots of tuberous begonias under cover until the stalks fall away. Store the tubers as they are, dry and cleaned of soil, lets not forget that the Dahlia tubers should be lifted and stored along with Gladioli corms that should be lifted and stored for next year.

So while the weather is

kind head out and finish clipping evergreen hedges and topiary to leave clean lines on which the autumn and winter sun can play. Using secateurs shorten back to their base any shoots that are starting to run up the hedge. This helps keep the hedge slim line and also avoids it splaying out in the long term. Yes, there always is jobs to do in the garden, it's just a case of a bit at a time and enjoy the process. But it isn't all about work, there are plants to enjoy too, Winter Snowball produces pink fragrant flowers while the branches are still bare, this plant is adorned with these decorative pink umbels from November to March and come the end of the winter, as the weather becomes slightly warmer,

the flowers fade to white.



There are many hidden hazards around our homes and gardens that can cause problems for curious paws. Here's a few things to be aware of in Autumn:

- Conkers and acorns:
 These are toxic to dogs.
 Poisoning cases are rare,
 but they can also cause
 stomach problems, vomiting
 and intestinal blockages if
 they're eaten.
- Blue-green algae: This algae is really toxic and can kill pets quickly if they eat it. The algae blooms from late spring to early autumn and looks like a blue-green scum on the water. Dogs who love a dip are most at risk so if you're worried about the look of the water, don't let your dog go in for a swim or drink it.
- Antifreeze: Autumn brings colder weather with it and you might start using antifreeze to defrost your car. This is really toxic to pets but can be very tempting, especially to cats, because it has a sweet taste. Mop up any spills carefully when you top up your car.
- Fireworks: If your adult pet is frightened of fireworks, you can help them prepare for bonfire night by gradually getting them used to the strange sounds and loud bangs they'll hear.
- Be Seen: As the days become shorter, owners are more likely to walk their dogs in the dark. To remain visible to drivers, cyclists and other people that are out walking, consider getting some reflective or high-visibility clothing for you and your dog.
- Keep Them Warm: Rabbits and guinea pigs lose heat quickly so it's important to keep them nice and warm.



Though rabbits can adapt rather well to the cold, they do suffer if their hutch is damp or if there is a draught. During really cold nights, you should move your small furries indoors or at the very least to somewhere well sheltered.

- Keep an Eye on your Pet's Weight: Not unlike humans, cats and dogs are less active during the colder months. Cats are less inclined to roam or explore, and dogs' walks are expected to be shorter in the bad weather. With them exercising less, be sure to monitor your pet's food intake. Stick to their recommended food allowance and avoid giving treats or scraps. If your pets are bored indoors, consider playing some enrichment games with them.
- Problems with fleas and ticks both increase over the autumn period, with a peak when people start turning on their central heating. Make sure you use flea and tick control and check your pets' coats often. If a tick is found, make sure to use the correct tick removal kit.

Be Safe And Follow The Firework Code

- Only adults should deal with setting up firework displays, the lighting of fireworks and the safe disposal of fireworks once they have been used.
- Plan your firework display to make it safe and enjoyable and check the time you can legally set off fireworks.
- · Only buy fireworks which carry the CE mark, keep them in a closed box and use them one at a time.
- Read and follow the instructions on each firework using a torch if necessary.
- · Light the firework at arm's length with a taper and stand well back.
- Keep naked flames, including cigarettes, away from fireworks.
- · Never return to a firework once it has been lit.
- Don't put fireworks in pockets and never throw them.
- Direct any rocket fireworks well away from spectators.
- · Never use paraffin or petrol on a bonfire.
- · Make sure that the fire is out, and surroundings are made safe before leaving.
